## What is the art of portraiture?

Students will embark on a guided discussion through the *Brian Brake: Lens on the world* exhibition focusing on key images, followed by a practical workshop.

Using digital cameras, students will become portrait photographers for the session, taking photos in response to the images they have seen.

Students will then use photo-editing skills to select the best portrait to print and keep.
